Design and Craftsmanship:

Central Sapphire: The focal point of the ring is a vivid emerald-cut sapphire, secured by four prongs and surrounded by a cascade of smaller round sapphires and diamonds. The sapphire's deep blue hue contrasts beautifully with the brilliance of the surrounding diamonds.

Diamond Accents: Twelve round brilliant-cut diamonds are interspersed among the sapphires, adding a touch of sparkle and further enhancing the ring's opulence.
