

A fine Chinese Qianlong Canton enamel bowl, the interior painted with four, five clawed dragons, in green, pink, red and blue, each surrounded by colourful clouds on a white ground, the exteriorpainted with scattered flowers and trailing leaves on a rich Imperial yellow ground. The base paintedwith a blue dragon and with applied label 'Chien Lung Period 1736-1795 AD'. 18.5 cm diameter.
