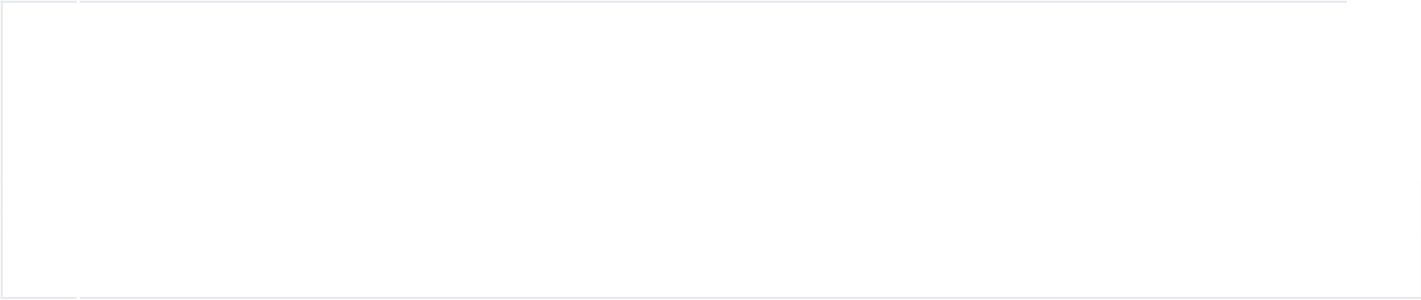


A pair of rare early Chinese Qianlong Canton enamel ladles/spoons POA

A pair of rare early Chinese Qianlong Canton enamel ladles/spoons, with gilt peacock head terminals, the necks painted with peacock feathers, the interiors painted with pink bats and clouds, the exteriors painted with trailing leaves and flowers, with painted fruit to each base. 10 cm long. Provenance: Spink & Son. Purchased by the vendors in the 1960s. This piece was loaned by the vendors to be included in an exhibition of Chinese Painted Enamel at the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford in 1978, curated by Michael Gillingham.
