This is an intricately carved hardwood campaign table crafted by Jabbar Khan & Son of Kashmir around the early 1900s.

Design and Craftsmanship:

The tabletop and apron are richly adorned with meticulously carved dragons, flowers, and traditional symbols, showing an impressive depth and attention to detail. The front of the table features dragons with five claws on each front limb, a symbol often associated with imperial power in Chinese culture, though here it is likely incorporated as a design choice to appeal to British and colonial tastes for Eastern motifs.

Folding Base and Portability:

One of the unique features of this table is its folding base, characteristic of campaign furniture. Campaign furniture was specifically designed to be portable, making it ideal for officers and officials who needed high-quality, functional furniture that could be easily transported.

Historical Significance and Craft Origins:

Jabbar Khan & Son, based in Kashmir, were known artisans who catered to British and colonial tastes during the time, producing furniture with both functional value and ornate aesthetics. The fusion of Kashmiri craftsmanship with motifs inspired by Chinese and Mughal art demonstrates the cross-cultural influences that characterized the colonial period. This piece would have been made to appeal to British officers or expatriates with a taste for exotic and intricately designed furniture that reflected the cultures of the regions they occupied.

Material and Condition:

Constructed from hardwood, likely walnut or cedar native to the Kashmir region, the table has aged gracefully, showing a rich patina that enhances the beauty of the carvings. The wood itself is sturdy, with minor wear that adds character to its century-old history.
